Main Activities Planned For the Future

April 14: Teachers continue to direct learning at home

May 11: Planned date of return to school

The chronology presents the main events from the most recent to the oldest.

April 17: Distribution of Chrome books to grade 12 students begins

April 17: Distribution of non-tech learning packages for students begins

April 16: PEI declares a state of emergency

April 3: Department of Education and Lifelong Learning published resources for Islanders and families

March 31: Department of Education and Lifelong Learning announced that teachers will conduct home learning for students beginning April 6th. All provincial assessments were canceled

March 27: Province extends school closure until May 11

March 26: PSB Student Services Facebook page was launched to support and keep parents and caregivers up-to-date

March 25: Director Parker Grimmer begins weekly communications to PSB parents/guardians and students

March 25: Additional Home Learning Resources were made available on the PSB and Department of Education and Lifelong Learning website

- March 20: PSB announced that all out of province PSB sanctioned school based student travel is canceled for March, April and May. Non-essential school based events and activities are canceled for the remainder of March, April and May
- March 17: PSB prepares to support and keep students, parents, staff and PSB community informed on Learning Supports via the PSB website and PSB Facebook pages
- March 16: Premier King declares a Public Health Emergency for PEI
- March 15: CPHO and Minister Trivers announced closures of all Child Care Centres and public schools in response to COVID-19 on PEI until April 6, 2020
- March 14: First case of COVID-19 virus confirmed in PEI
- March 9: CPHO released information for families travelling during the March Break regarding COVID-19
